The PCC of Wilmslow parish would like to apply for this money in order to enable us to continue our extended food bank project ("Food Friend"). This project began in 2011 as an attempt to provide support for individuals and families who for whatever reason found themselves unable to "put food on their table".

The aim is to provide short term assistance for clients in the SK9 area until they are able to access benefits or employment.

With the support of Wilmslow Town Council we extended this provision in 2014 by having the church open 4 or 5 mornings per week and the project run by a trained counsellor. We presently have nearly 300 households registered with the scheme and have also been helping a few homeless people right on our doorstep. We wish to be able to continue this work.

Numbers of people using our service is rising at the moment due to many people falling through the gaps with the rolling out of universal credit; often having to wait 6 weeks for benefits to come through.

Another £5,000 would enable us to "top up" the funds of the project further – securing its future for over a year - as it continues to grow; also as a result of the closure of Hampers of Hope.

Our balance is currently £9,213 which on average will last us 9 months.

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4.4 Please state how it will benefit the Wilmslow Community.

Given the demand for assistance from Food Friend over the last few years, it is clear that the current economic climate - and now changes with the benefits system - has meant that a significant number of local individuals and families are genuinely struggling to provide food for themselves. The church wishes to support such members of the community by providing short term assistance to as many people as possible in the SK9 area until they are able once again to support themselves.

It has further been our experience that people in this kind of situation and in an increasingly fragmented society, also find themselves isolated or under considerable emotional strain of one form or another. This is why having a trained counsellor running the project is of such benefit; to offer a listening ear.

We have also found that our clients come seeking information about other sources of support e.g. housing or legal issues. We are increasingly linking them or networking with other agencies such as CAB in order to help support them.

A number of young people from Wilmslow High School have volunteered at Food Friend as part of their Duke of Edinburgh award scheme and 'make a difference day'. This gives them an insight into the wider social issues and concerns in the area. Three young people with special needs are involved with their carers in collecting and sorting food.

Sometimes food bank clients 'give back' when they are back on their feet by helping maintain the Church grounds, for example.

The aim of this project is, therefore, to try to benefit the Wilmslow community by meeting the needs of some of its most vulnerable members in the ways described above. The church sees this as a fundamental part of its work in the community, but needs financial assistance from other bodies such as the Town Council in order to fulfil this role.

New support for our clients is also being explored; to tackle issues of addiction etc. through a structured course.
